Focusing on the true sentiment of the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA), we began our journey in 2006 towards designing products which were attractive and challenging to as many users as possible, whilst breaking down social and physical barriers.



Engaging specialists such as Capability Scotland, Barnardos and Action for Children, considerations such as ease of transfer, stimulation of the senses and manual dexterity have all been crucial in the developmental phase. Feedback from carers and children alike has given us the insight and understanding needed for this specific range.

Most important to us, however, has been the essential goal of creating and sourcing products which encourage children of all abilities to play together.

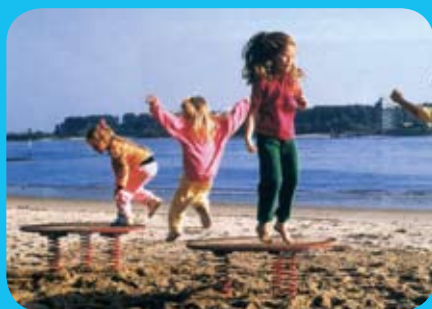

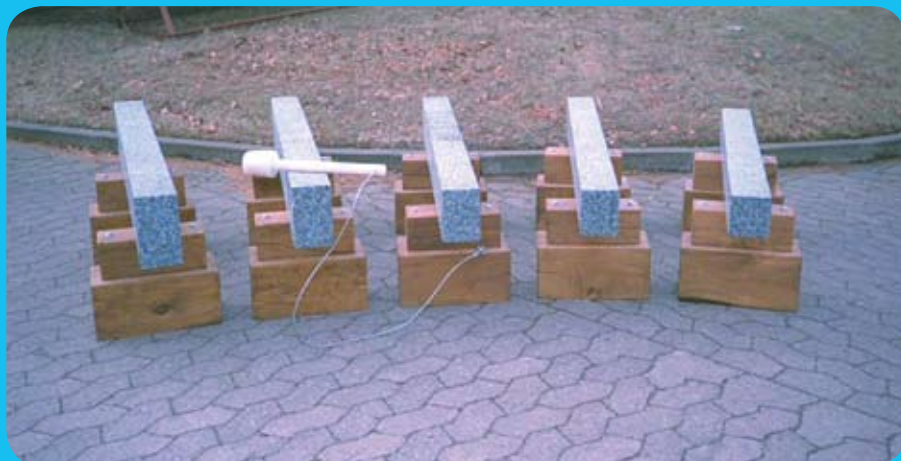

**The Exosphere** is a two-in-one activity. One side offers mesmerising visual stimulation, creating patterns at the spin of a wheel; the other side requires skill and patience to guide the ball through the maze, using the wheel, to the centre of the unit.

The Exosphere bolts directly onto a concrete pad for easy installation and access. The steering wheel is set at the optimum height for a wheel chair user.

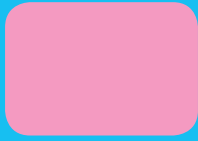
